Solid Waste Cost Disclosure

The Solid Waste Policy and Management Act of 1991 and Full Cost Disclosure Regulation 61-107.2 require that all local governments that provide solid waste management services publish the full cost of its solid waste management services for the previous fiscal year. In compliance with this law, The Town of McClellanville reports that the cost for solid waste collection in McClellanville for fiscal year 2017/2018 was \$25,500; per capita cost of \$51.10.

TriCounty Link is continuously working to improve transit service offered to the McClellanville area. Starting on September 4, 2018, the TriCounty Link route, **C203**, will be modified to enhance connectivity and on-time performance.

To better serve our customers, the route connecting the Town with Mt. Pleasant has changed. Transit service will begin at Pinckney St/Society Rd going to Mt Pleasant and coming back to Village from Mt Pleasant it will end at 10105 US 17 N / Kangaroo Express. It will no longer travel to McClellanville Town Hall and has been extended to Society Road and Toby Road via S. Pinckney Street. The departure times have been adjusted slightly based on customer requests, particularly on Saturday where the return trip to McClellanville will depart the Oakland Plantation Wal-Mart at 4:30 p.m. in response to customer requests. The service will still operate six day per week and serves all the same locations along Hwy. 17.

TriCounty Link is the public transit system serving the rural portions of Charleston County, managed by the BCD Council of Governments. The fare is still \$2.25 with free transfers to the CARTA system. Look for new schedule brochures that will be distributed shortly or visit the website,

Lighthouse Update - Tommy Graham:

Work on structural repairs to the Cape Romain Lighthouse is about to begin. The first task is to replace the failing heavy iron steps in the new (1858) tower. Safety requires that the replacement be done from the top down because of the likelihood of some of these heavy steps falling during the removal / replacement process. The work beginning at the top requires temporary access by installing a series of ladders on the side of the tower. Four ladders and five decks projecting from windows need to be installed. We need volunteers with boats to help bring supplies out to the island and healthy individuals to carry items from boats up to the tower. All work on the island must take place in a "tide window" between half high and half low water. This varies from day to day. 28 yrs. ago, we purchased the McClellanville Telephone Co. building after it was damaged by Hurricane Hugo. We repaired and remodeled it to create a community center where we offer art exhibitions, lectures, concerts, classes and workshops for all ages, often free of charge. Last year, we noticed water stains on the ceiling, and lately we have needed buckets to catch the drips. Now, with the 2018 hurricane season upon us, we must replace our roof. We have licensed roofing contractors and carpenters standing by. What we do not have is \$10,000 to pay for the work, so we are asking our supporters to help us. (Please mark it "Roof Fund.") \$100 or more and your name will appear on a permanent plaque in the gallery.

When Flooding is Imminent

- Begin implementing your emergency plan.
- Remind your family to stay inside and away from all flood waters and downed power lines.
- Listen to local media updates and alerts.
- Move valuables to higher areas.
- Securely anchor or store outdoor furniture.
- Sandbag areas subject to the entry of water.
- If evacuations are ordered, follow instructions, shut off gas and electricity, evacuate promptly, and securely lock your home or business.

During the Flood

- Stay inside. Avoid contact with all flood waters and downed power lines.
- Turn around, don't drown. Never drive through flooded areas or any water.
- Do not wade through any water as it may contain toxic materials or venomous animals or insects.
- Check local media and official websites such as FEMA.gov and CharlestonCounty.org for emergency notifications.
- If your dwelling begins to flood, shut off electricity and gas connections.

After the Flood

- Upon return from an evacuation, if your building is flooded or otherwise damaged, **do not:**
 - occupy dwelling until officially notified it is safe.
 - turn on any electrical switches or appliances.
- If you smell gas, immediately contact your utility company or emergency personnel.
- Remove standing water with a portable sump pump once flood waters have receded.
- Remove wet insulation, drywall, flooring and rugs.
- Contact your insurance agent if you have damage.
- Hire contractors only after verifying they are properly licensed.
- Obtain proper permits for all work.
- Refer questions or complaints about contractors and permits to your local jurisdiction.
